Proposals are especially welcome from research students and practitioners, as well as academics.

Presenters may elect to offer:

A. A full paper 1 month before the conference to be made available on the conference website, and at the conference offer a 10 minute summary followed by 35 minutes of discussion and workshoping (45 minutes in total); i.e. to encourage maximum engagement and discussion OR

B. Present a full paper at the conference for 20 minutes, followed by 10 minutes of questions and discussion (30 minutes total)

Please indicate in your proposal which option you would prefer. (Anyone who does not submit their paper a month before the conference will be allocated the 30 minute slots).

Panel presentations, of multiple papers or presentations on the same theme, are welcome from collaborative researchers or researchers exploring similar areas, and these will be given priority as papers are considered.
